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After Jesus' resurrection from the dead, Luke says he appeared to his disciples and said, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things." (Luke 24: 46-48)

Christians around the world have borne witness to "those things" ever since, and yet, as Jesus says, the movement begins in Jerusalem. The movement we inherit in Pennsylvania has its roots in the land Christ called home, both rugged and beautiful, and our sisters and brothers in the movement continue to bear witness through hospitals and schools that serve the most marginalized in the name of Jesus.



Led by the Rt. Rev. Daniel Gutiérrez, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Pennsylvania, this pilgrimage will encounter the Gospel in stone and flesh, visiting the sights that mark the story of our faith and the people who keep that faith alive in the Holy Land today, with special emphasis on the people and institutions of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem. We'll come home changed, restored, and renewed.




"We moved from bustling, populated areas full of life, to soil, and then to the desert," Gutiérrez said of the 2019 pilgrimage. "Whether it was the twisted branches and trunks of olive trees in the Garden of Gethsemane, the poppies that lined the path of the Via Maris, the sweeping vistas from the Mount of Transfiguration, or the isolation of the barren landscape in the Judean Desert, all in our group were touched. Prayers lifted us to a level of unexpected tranquility."

DAY ONE

DEPART U.S.

Travel to Tel Aviv on the airline and flight of your choice, flying overnight



RCH 12

DAY TWO

ARRIVE

Travel to Jerusalem and settle in to the Guest House and neighborhood between Saint George's Cathedral and Damascus Gate



ARCH 13

DAY THREE

JERUSALEM & HERODIUM

We tour Jerusalem's perimeter to appreciate its geography, and then to Tekoa in the southern West Bank to visit Herod's palace in the Judean Desert. Over three nights, three guest speakers provide modern-day context from Muslim, Christian, and Jewish perspectives.



1ARCH 12

DAY FOUR

CAESAREA MARATIMA & NAZARETH

We depart for a seaport built on the Mediterranean Sea by Herod the Great and then we drive north to Nazareth, our home for three nights. This afternoon we visit Mary's Well and the site of the Annunciation.




ARCH 15

DAY FIVE

SEA OF GALILEE

We renew our baptismal vows at the Jordan River, celebrate the Holy Eucharist on the Mount of Beatitudes, tour Capernaum and Tabgha, and take a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee



RCH 16

DAY SIX

SEPPHORIS & CAESAREA PHILIPPI

We take a detailed walk through the ruins of Sepphoris, the largest Roman city nearest Nazareth, where Joseph likely did much of his work. In the afternoon, we visit the Golan Heights and the site of the Temple of Pan, where Jesus asked, "Who do you say that I am?"



1ARCH 17

DAY SEVEN

THE WEST BANK

Our day starts with Holy Eucharist at Saint Matthew's Episcopal Church in Zababdeh. Returning to Jerusalem, we travel through the West Bank, visiting the Church of the Ten Lepers in Burqin, Jacob's Well in Nablus, and for fun, Taybeh Brewery, the first brewery in Palestine



DAY EIGHT

BETHLEHEM

We say Morning Prayer in the field where the angels visited the shepherds, make a prayerful visit to the Church of the Nativity, and take a solemn walk along the separation wall that divides Bethlehem from Jerusalem, grounding the birthplace of the Prince of Peace in its context here today



ARCH 19

DAY NINE

PRINCESS BASMA CENTER & FREE AFTERNOON

We visit the Princess Basma Center for Disabled Children on the Mount of Olives, the Center is home to the victims of paralysis, strokes, debilitating injuries and other physical and emotional needs.



1ARCH 20

DAY TEN

JERUSALEM & RAMALLAH

We tour the Western Wall and Dome of the Rock, and visit the Israel Museum to study the Dead Sea Scrolls.



DAY ELEVEN

FULL FREE DAY

This full free day allows greater flexibility. Explore the Old City in greater detail, take a quick cab ride to visit the Holocaust Memorial, or make a day trip to Masada and Qumran.

The possibilities are endless.



ARCH 22

DAY TWELVE

THE OLD CITY

This day focuses primarily on the Church of the Resurrection, or Church of the Holy Sepulcher, in Jerusalem's Old City. We'll allow time for both our head and our heart to absorb its holiness.




MARCH 23

DAY THIRTEEN

JERICHO, MOUNT OF TEMPTATION & THE DEAD SEA

An early morning visit to the desert is followed by a hike up the Mount of Temptation. Lunch is at the Qumri's followed by a trip to the Dead Sea, where you will have the option to swim(float).



MARCH 24

DAY FOURTEEN

WORSHIP & FREE AFTERNOON

We will worship with our siblings at St. George's Cathedral in Jerusalem, and then We walk the Palm Sunday procession down the Mount of Olives, and make a prayerful visit to Gethsemane.



ARCH 25

DAY FIFTEEN

WAY OF THE CROSS & EMMAUS

We make an early morning procession of the Stations of the Cross ending our time together with the Holy Eucharist at the ruins of the Byzantine Church at Emmaus.

Flights home should be scheduled for this evening, transfer to Ben Gurion Airport is included.



A PURPOSEFUL PILGRIMAGE

FIVE COMMITMENTS WE MAKE

- Each day will include prayer, either the Daily Office or the Celebration of the Holy Eucharist with local congregations or in holy sites like the Judean Desert, the Mount of Beatitudes, and the ruins of Emmaus.
- We will pray for one another in assigned prayer partnerships, and through our shared meals, we will create lasting relationships with our fellow pilgrims.
- We commit to deepening our relationship to the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem by praying with our siblings and celebrating their ministries, such as at the Princess Basma Center, a safe, healing place for children with disabilities.
- While this pilgrimage is not a political tour, we commit to bearing witness to the experience of Christians, Muslims, and Jews through our travels and in several evening presentations.
- While the itinerary is always tentative, given political and pandemic uncertainties in the region, we commit to providing an equally appealing alternative if our plans should change.

WHERE WE STAY

IN JERUSALEM ST. GEORGE'S GUESTHOUSE



Accommodations are well regarded here at the guesthouse adjacent to St. George's Cathedral, and the gardens are sublime.

Accommodations are a bit monastic here but the rooms are very well kept, and the central location and breathtaking rooftop views don't disappoint.

WHO ARE OUR LEADERS?

The Rt. Rev. Daniel Gutiérrez is the pilgrimage's spiritual leader. The Rev. Canon Shawn Wamsley coordinates logistics before and during the trip, and Canon Iyad Qumri, a Palestinian Episcopalian with decades of experience making pilgrimages meaningful, is our local guide.

HOW ARE WE GETTING THERE?

Pilgrims will have the opportunity to book their own flight to Tel Aviv from the airport of their choice, maximizing travel flexibility. Airport arrival information and tips on traveling from the airport to Jerusalem will be provided. Occasionally ground travel can be arranged if several flight times align.

WHAT WILL I NEED TO TRAVEL?

A passport not to expire before October 1st, 2024. Visas are not required for U.S. citizens. Pilgrims must be vaccinated against COVID-19 and provide documentation.

AM I HEALTHY ENOUGH?

There is a large amount of walking on this pilgrimage, much of it uphill or on uneven terrain, and many sites require the use of stairs. On-site lectures often require standing, and much of the day is spent outside. Some churches use ample incense which may upset some allergies. The pilgrimage leaders will make every effort to accommodate your physical needs but may ask that you sit a particular activity out or help you craft an alternative personal day if you are unable to keep up with the group. It is not uncommon to walk 5 - 10 miles per day.

MAY I INVITE A FRIEND?

Of course! While the pilgrimage is rooted in Anglican spirituality, it is open to all people.

WHAT ELSE MAY I EXPECT?

Canon Wamsley is available to answer any questions you might have. Expect a reading list, and tips on packing and pandemic travel. You will have an opportunity to meet your fellow pilgrims at an orientation prior to the trip.



- Final balance, including single supplement if applicable, is due by Feb. 1st 2024.

CANCELLATIONS&REFUNDS

- All payments are non-refundable once received.
- Pilgrims must obtain travel insurance with a cancellation clause. The Episcopal Diocese of Pennsylvania organizes this pilgrimage at cost, and while every effort will be made to refund when feasible, it cannot refund funds already expended, allocated for expense, or dispersed to our travel partners.
- All notice of cancellations must be received and acknowledged in writing.
- If the trip must be cancelled by the Episcopal Diocese of Pennsylvania or Qumri Pilgrimages, all funds minus the \$700 deposit will be refunded.
- The proposed itinerary is subject to change, and refunds are not available should the pilgrimage not include a particular site.
